### Report of the Tourism Committee Meeting – April 9th, 2019

<u>Tourism booth at AMANB conference (FREE)</u> – A free Tourism Booth opportunity is available for the AMANB Conference in June 2019. A recommendation was made to partner with

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municipalities in Saint John River Valley for a regional tourism booth to be staffed by Brittney Toner.

<u>Amendments to the Local Governance Act Respecting Tourism Accommodation</u> – Mayor Slipp provide clarification of the Levy requirements and collection. The item was referred to Finance Committee.

Creek Village, Connecting for Life, and Townsview School Sponsorship Applications:

Townsview School – An application was received requesting \$5,000 for paving paths and walkways to make their playground accessible. The application was referred to Finance Committee.

Connecting for Life – An application was received requesting \$826 to cover the rental and custodial fees for an event in the Community Theatre. A recommendation to sponsor an amount of \$250 for the rental of the theatre was made.

Creek Village – An application was received requesting \$3576 for operational assistance and continuity. A decision was made to table a recommendation until more information is provided on the project and a budget for the amount request is submitted.

<u>Beardsley Hill Proposal</u> – A proposal has been submitted by Renata Woodward of the Nature Trust of New Brunswick outlining the "Beardsley Hill Project." The item was referred to Committee of the Whole.

Report of the Public Works and Water and Sewer Committee Meeting – April 17th, 2019

CAO Pinsent summarized the report of the Public Works and Water and Sewer Committee meeting:

Bylaw for garbage collection – Blue Bins and garbage collection for multi residential properties:

- The Town does not speak to recycling in its current bylaw and the growth of the program (new bins) needs to be addressed. The committee endorses a plan that would involve the payment of new bins from Town funds on an as required basis. The exact process would have to be worked out, but in general terms the Town office would issue a voucher to a local hardware store such that a resident can acquire a bin. Money would be set aside in annual budgets for these expenditures.
- A new bylaw would require greater clarity on who pays for the garbage collected from apartments and what containers should be used. The committee endorsed a bylaw which would have the owners of apartments pay for the garbage collection and a bylaw which would stipulate which containers would be used and how these containers are stored (small shed like structures) on the landowner's property. This would help alleviate some of the unsightly complaints the Town has been receiving from residents about garbage.

<u>Cindy MacMillan and Madison Vallis</u> – Pothole Reimbursement Request – The committee did not support the reimbursement for damages to tires and rims as a result of potholes in the community.

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<u>Utility exemption for certain groups</u> – It has come to staff's attention that certain organizations in town are not paying utility charges. Staff was asked to gather a list of those organizations which don't pay for utilities and bring it forward for council's review. If there are exemptions, they should be formally documented.
