## Proclamation – Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

**WHEREAS**, awareness and conversations about prostate cancer can lead to screening and early detection that saves lives, and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Woodstock supports Prostate Cancer Canada and everyone committed to raising awareness about prostate cancer;

**THEREFORE**, I, Mayor Slipp, on behalf of Woodstock Town Council, do hereby proclaim **September 2019 as Prostate Cancer Awareness Month** in the Town of Woodstock.
